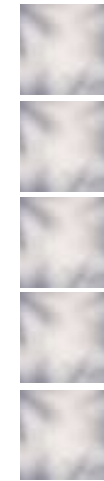

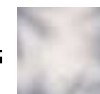

- Acts of violence
- Heart attack of a staff member during a meeting
- Car accident of students who live in a residence hall
- Suicide
- Community trauma
- Death of a student in their room
- Sexual assault
- Sudden death of an athlete during a game
- Death of an employee on the job

Crises are sudden, unpredictable, and traumatic events!

They are traumatic and stressful not only for those involved, but for those who respond and care for the survivors (i.e., fellow co-workers, students, staff, staff counselors, colleagues, and administrator staff, etc.). Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) is a method of crisis intervention to help address the emotional needs of those who have been through a crisis. CISM allows peers and lay people

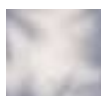
to work with mental health professionals to provide support and intervention for those in crisis in order to reduce the long-term impact of trauma. The Counseling and Career Development Center is sponsoring training for CISM: Group Crisis Intervention presented by Eric Klingensmith, Psy.D. Dr. Klingensmith is approved through the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation.

A) Audience:

- Higher education professionals who deal with crisis situations on their campuses.
- Mental health professionals who desire to increase their knowledge of group crisis intervention techniques.
- Emergency services, military, business/industry, and non-mental health personnel (those without formal mental health training), but want to learn to support mental health professionals during crisis.

B) Objectives:

- 1) To increase awareness of key terms and concepts relevant to the practice of crisis intervention.
- 2) To become familiar with relevant recommendations for practice.
- 3) To understand the nature and importance of incident assessment and strategic intervention planning.
- 4) To understand the nature of the “resistance, resilience, recovery” continuum and the role of the integrated, multi-component Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) system.
- 5) To become familiar with large group crisis interventions.
- 6) To become familiar with small group crisis interventions.
- 7) To become familiar with risks of adverse outcome associated with crisis intervention and how to reduce those risks.
- 8) To practice large and small group crisis interventions by means of exercises.



Eric Klingensmith, Psy.D., P.E.M.

Presenter is a trained International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF) instructor.

Dr. Eric Klingensmith completed his Doctorate in Clinical Psychology (Psy.D.) from Antioch New England Graduate School and received his PEM in 2004. He has been involved in disaster mental health since responding with a State of Florida mental health team to the aftermath of Hurricane Andrew. He has been on several crisis response team efforts including responses to schools, hospitals, private industry, and communities. Currently, Eric is Coordinator of Crisis Intervention Services at Grand Valley State University's Counseling and Career Development Center and Housing/Residence Life Offices. He also coordinates the center's Critical Incident Response Team.

Outside of Grand Valley State University, Eric is also active with the American Red Cross of Ottawa County's Disaster Mental Health Team and serves on the Chapter's Board of Directors. He is also a member of the Ottawa County HAZMAT Team and the Michigan-1 DMAT team. He has spoken across the country on several disaster mental health and emergency management topics including: Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM), Family Assistance Centers, Providing Assistance to Families Following Aviation Accidents, Emergency Management for Colleges and Universities, Diversity and Cultural Issues in Emergency Planning and Response, and How to Develop Mental Health Crisis Services on University Campuses.
