Code Busters – B & C	
 FAQ: Ciphers will be based on International Morse Code. 	
Detector Building – C	
 FAQ: Yes, you can solder your basic components to the breadboard to make a more permanent connection. 	
Flight – B & C	
 These events will take place at the Kelly Family Sports Center. Planes must slide easily in and out of the box. Any bending is a construction violation. 	
Forestry – B & C	
 FAQ: The published Tree List will be used to evaluate answers at all tournaments as established by the rules even if a tree on the list has since had a change in scientific family name since the list was published. 	
Robot	
 Event takes place on a wood floor, like a basketball court. FAQ: The only files that can be viewed or modified during the competition are the files impounded on the USB drive as part of their single robot program. 	
Roller Coaster – B	
 FAQ: Teams may be allowed to alter the start and finish line BEFORE they are given the target time, but not after knowing it. FAQ: Once the device is leveled and in place to compete, the position of the start and finish lines relative to their place in space <i>must not change</i>. They should be marked on the device and not changed. Other parts of the device may be allowed to be changed. 	
Microbe Mission – B	
FAQ: Any measuring devices, if necessary, will be provided.	
Optics – B & C	
• FAQ: If a student moves a barrier while setting up there is no direct penalty, but the event supervisor will reset the barrier and the time that takes will be subtracted from their setup time.	
Trial Events	
 Aerial Scramble B & C will be a walk-up event. The tournament will provide planes that can be modified on site. Pentathlon B & C will be a walk-up event. The theme will be, "The Wild Wild West." Any school can have multiple teams compete in trial events (regardless of primary/alternate team status). Only one team is eligible for medals per school.
