Freshmen are required to live on campus. Once you have been admitted to GVSU, you should apply for housing online at gvsu.edu/housing. The housing application deadline is **May 1**, but students who apply early are more likely to receive their first or second housing choice.

# **Application Deadline for Merit-based Admission Scholarships**

We've extended the admissions deadline to be considered for merit-based scholarships from December 31 to March 1 for current high school seniors planning to start at Grand Valley in Fall 2022.

### Priority deadline for fling the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

File the FAFSA by March 1 to be considered for the maximum amount of financial aid.
