1. Fall 2023 Faculty Learning Communities are OPEN!

2. Fall 2023 Personnel Portfolio Workshop

The <u>Personnel Portfolio Workshop</u> is designed to support faculty going up for any personnel review in 2023-24. Working with an assigned faculty mentor, participants will compose their Personal/Reflective statement and, as time permits, prepare other supporting materials for their portfolio in accordance with their college and unit personnel policies.

3. Strong Start Teaching Institute

The <u>Strong Start Teaching Institute</u> focuses faculty attention on best practices for engaging students in first-year undergraduate courses. The Institute is intended primarily for instructors teaching courses with high first-year student enrollment. Preference will be given to non-tenure-track instructors: affiliates, visitors, adjuncts, and those new or relatively new to university teaching. The Institute is limited to 40 participants so register soon!

4. 29th Annual Fall Conference on Teaching and Learning

Keynote presentation by Dr. James M. Lang, author of *Distracted: Why Students Can't Focus and What You Can Do About It*, and former Professor of English and Director of the D'Amour Center for Teaching Excellence at Assumption University. You will also need to report the Last Date of Academic Activity (LDAA) for all students who are assigned a grade of W, F, or NC. Assigning Incomplete Grades - A grade of "I" (incomplete) is to be assigned only in truly extenuating circumstances and only if the student has completed most (minimum of 2/3) of the work required for the course.
