Do I need to speak a foreign language?

NO! Most study abroad programs offer instruction in English, even in non-English speaking countries.

Can I afford to study abroad?

YES! Early planning for study abroad helps you make cost-effective program decisions, and it also helps you prepare your finances through savings, scholarships, and financial aid. Your financial aid applies to study abroad and, in some cases, your loan eligibility will increase to cover additional expenses. Furthermore, the Padnos International Center offers grants and scholarships specifically for qualified study abroad participants.

Will I take longer to graduate?

NO! With good advance planning, you can take courses that satisfy elective requirements in your IR/PLS major or the general education program.

What classes can I take while studying abroad?

China: Summer School (spring and/or summer, faculty-led)

This program will operate during the Spring and Summer terms in Shanghai, China. Students may enroll for the Spring term (6 weeks), the Summer term (6 weeks) or both (12 weeks). Each term you will register for two or three courses in language, area studies and/or general education. Courses will be taught by faculty from GVSU and from East China Normal University in Shanghai.

India: Business and Culture (spring, faculty-led)

India is a stable democracy that blends its own rich tradition and British legal and educational systems. Program participants will visit Delhi, India's capital; the legendary Taj Mahal; and Mumbai, a large, cosmopolitan metropolis. They will attend classes at an Indian university located in the lovely, temperate city of Pune, about 100 miles from Mumbai.

Mexico (semester or year)

UDLA is located in the municipality of San Andres Cholula, only fifteen minutes from the city of Puebla and 90 miles from Mexico City. This geographic region brings together the influences of pre-Hispanic, colonial, and modern Mexico and is recognized by UNESCO as a cultural treasure of the world. On a clear day one can see Malinche mountain and three of Mexico's tallest volcanoes from campus. Although specific course equivalencies are not yet available, this university offers a wide range of courses that can be used to fulfill IR and PLS electives.

Nicaragua (summer, faculty-led)

The focus of the program is the psychology of social inequality, or the unequal distribution of power and resources across class, race, and gender. Nicaragua has a long history of struggles against social injustice, and thus provides an ideal vehicle for studying issues of inequality. The program will begin on the GVSU campus, where we will study inequality within the context of the culture and history of Nicaragua.

Students can take a variety of political science, history, and economics courses in English, including a program of instruction entitled, "Poland: Economy in Transition." Spain: University of Deusto, Bilbao (summer)

The university is located opposite the world-famous Guggenheim Museum in the green, northern city of Bilbao. This program will include coursework in Spanish Business and International Relations, and includes visits to companies and cultural sites. A three-day visit to Madrid is included. Students can earn elective credits in International Relations, Business and Spanish.

Turkey (summer, semester or year)

Imagine a world-class research institution, a forested campus of over 11,000 acres, a rich history with ancient artifacts continually unearthed on campus, and regular bus service to clear Mediterranean beaches: you have Middle East Technical University in Ankara. Summer Internship Programs

GVSU London Internship Program

Students who participate in this program work full time, five days a week, for 8 weeks. Internships take place in businesses, museums, international organizations, non-government organizations, law offices, etc. Students enroll in an internship course at Grand Valley State University supervised by a GVSU internship coordinator. The program begins with a week-long orientation prior to the commencement of the internship.

GVSU Madrid Internship Program

Madrid offers unparalleled opportunities for students seeking a professional internship in a Spanish-speaking workplace. Placements are available for undergraduates in one of Madrid's many businesses or NGOs. The program begins with a 3-week intensive Spanish language course that prepares students to work in a Spanish-speaking environment. In the afternoons, students participate in excursions and cultural activities that introduce them to Spanish culture and society. Subsequently, students participate in a 9-week internship, working 36 hours a week.

GVSU Paris Internship Program

Paris offers excellent internship opportunities in many French-speaking workplaces, including international organizations, businesses, and NGOs. The program begins with a 3-week intensive French language course that prepares students to work in a French-speaking environment. In the afternoons, students participate in excursions that introduce them to French culture and society. Following this, students participate in a 9-week internship, working 35 hours a week in a professional setting.

Independent (non-GVSU) Programs

In addition to the above listed GVSU or GVSU-partner programs, PLS and IR students will find the programs below particularly attractive.

School for International Training (SIT) Study Abroad Programs

SIT offers program options focused on themes such as Peace and Conflict Studies, Social Justice, or Development Studies. These programs enable students to gain language proficiency, further understanding of the host culture, and develop knowledge of a particular subject. The following programs are recommended:
