Several circle formats will be presented from the field of restorative practices, which have a proven track record of use in many different contexts to cultivate curiosity, build empathy and promote meaningful conversation across issues that divide us. The workshop will be interactive, with opportunity to practice what we are learning.

## **Objectives**

- 1. Participants in this workshop will be able to discuss the interconnectedness of humanity and how meaningful conversation is an important part of living into that reality.
- 2. Participants in this workshop will be able to name three key practices identified by Jim Henderson and Jim Hancock for crossing differences.
- 3. Participants will gain a working knowledge of how circles might be used in various contexts.
