Beyond Grateful: Reflections on Korean Adoptees in the United States

In her presentation, Dr. McKee will present excerpts from her monograph, Disrupting Kinship: Transnational Politics of Korean Adoption in the United States (University of Illinois Press, 2019). McKee will unpack the macro and micro dimensions of adoption in the lives of Korean adoptees. Part of this talk includes a discussion of adoptees who push back against notions that adoption is a humanitarian, child-saving act. At the same time, McKee highlights recent adoptee activism concerning retroactive citizenship for those adoptees whose parents or guardians failed to naturalize them as U.S. citizens as children.
