Celebrating Indigenous Peoples' Day

Students and members from local Native American communities gathered on October 9, 2017 to honor and celebrate

Grand Valley State University's first observance of Indigenous Peoples' Day, formerly known as Columbus Day. The event honored and made space on campus for Indigenous people, specifically Anishinaabe people, whose ancestral land includes West Michigan and GVSU campuses. In collaboration with OMA, members of the Native American Student Association hosted a round dance performed by dancers from around West Michigan. A panel of GVSU Native American alumni and current students discussed the significance of the change from Columbus Day to Indigenous Peoples' Day. They shared their experiences as Native Americans and challenged attendees to remember Native American rights and to continue to learn about Native American cultures.
