# **Open Access Publishing Support Fund**

- The primary goal of this program is to remove financial barriers that prevent researchers from publishing in open access journals
- The Libraries will cover up to \$3,000 of author submission fees to support the ability of researchers to publish in established open access peer-reviewed journals and peer-reviewed journals that have an open access option


# Cayuse 424

Prior to the start of any teaching or research effort, GVSU faculty, staff and students should be aware of training requirements, regulatory compliance, and University policy when engaged in activities in the following areas:

- •The conduct of exempt and non-exempt human subjects research
- •Teaching or use activities involving vertebrate animals
- •Use of radioactive materials or radiation producing equipment; chemicals and other hazardous materials; biological agents and recombinant DNA
