## Classics-BA Degree Overview – Latin Secondary Education

The Latin Secondary Education Emphasis offers prospective Latin teachers preparation at a level consistent with state and national norms. *Please see the College of Education requirements on reverse.*

- Requires 18 credits of instruction in Latin at the 300 level or above, 3 of which must be **LAT 353 Latin Prose Composition (3)**.
- Requires 3 credits of instruction in any course in Classics (**CLA**), in HNR 154 – Classical World II (3), or in an approved substitute.

### Guide for Declaring the Classics Major with Emphasis

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select “Student”, “Student Records”, and then, “Change Major”
3. Click on the “Change Major 1/Program” box
4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to “New Major 1/Program,” scroll down and choose: “Classics Teaching – BA – Latin, Secondary Education”
5. Click “Submit” - For Latin Secondary Education emphasis students only: the system will automatically declare your 2<sup>nd</sup> major in “Education” and give you the option to declare a minor. Choose an appropriate minor from the list.
6. Select “Change to New Program”
