Declaring the CSAT with Special Education Major:

- 1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
- 2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
- 3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
- 4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program", from here scroll down and choose "Comprehensive Science and Arts for Teaching (BA)"
- 5. Click "Submit." The system will give you the option to add a second major. Choose "Special Education." You do not need to add a minor. Click "Change to New Program."
