[^0]${ }^{3}$ Minors are encouraged; "Elective" refers to any course needed in order to reach 120 total credits, which are required to earn a degree from GVSU. Additional degree requirements include completion of all major/minor requirements, all general education requirements, at least 58 credits from a 4 -year institution, and the last 30 credits of the degree completed through GVSU.

Study Abroad: It is highly recommended that French majors study abroad for at least a semester, where they often fulfill 15 credits towards the major, including the Gen Ed Issues requirement. If this is not feasible, majors should consider a summer program such as the 6-week faculty-led program in Bordeaux and Paris, France.
