## Guide for Declaring the Secondary Education Majors and Minor

- Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
- Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
- Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
- Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "French Teaching-BA-Secondary Education"
- Click "Submit." The system will automatically declare your 2<sup>nd</sup> major in "Education" and give you the option to declare a minor. Choose an appropriate minor from the list and then click "Change to New Program"

- 3. The Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC)** must be taken **after** all or most of major coursework is completed. Please see Professor Pettes-Guikema prior to registering for the test.

### Study Abroad Requirement

French majors interested in teacher certification are required to study abroad for **at least one semester** (12-15 credits at the 300-level) in a French-language study abroad program. Program must be approved prior to study abroad by a faculty advisor in French and can be used to fulfill major requirement courses. This is applicable for students who start fall 2014 and later. Students who are unable to complete the study abroad requirement will need to complete an **alternative plan** approved by a French advisor. Please meet with Professor Pettes-Guikema as soon as possible to discuss your options.
