- 1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
- Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
- Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
 Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "History Teaching-BA-Secondary Education" OR "History Teaching-BS-Secondary Education" depending on your degree
- 5. Click "Submit." The system will automatically declare your 2nd major in "Education" and give you the option to declare a minor
