<sup>1</sup> Students who self-place into WRT 120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of their first year. Students who self-place into WRT 150 should take the course in the fall semester. Students will not need to take WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

<sup>2</sup> Students who opt for the WRT 120/130 stretch writing sequence should plan to take PSY 301 during the spring/summer semester between first and second year of the program. Honors College students do not take WRT 150, 120, or 130 as their sequence covers this requirement.

These 10 weeks follow 10 weeks of general classroom internship, extending the semester by 5 weeks. Therefore, EDI 470 <b>must</b> occur in the winter semester only. <i>To be certified to teach ESL, students must have two semesters of a Foreign Language Requirement. This can be through language placement or though taking two semesters of the language.</i>

**Additional Advising Notes:**

- To be certified to teach elementary grades Pre-K – 3 and grades 3 - 6, students must complete a double major in PCKET and Educational Studies, as well as at least ONE Concentration or Endorsement.
- Students earning a teaching credential in special education will complete a major in Special Education and a major in PCKET, with specialized teaching endorsement major.
- Students are strongly encouraged to complete both elementary grade bands, PK-3 and 3-6, to increase their marketability.
- Students who pursue 3-6 certification are required to complete at least ONE Concentration or Endorsement. They are encouraged to complete more than one.
- Students who choose to pursue Pre-K-3 certification only are strongly encouraged to add at least one Endorsement (ESL) or push grade band to PK-6
- Concentration and Endorsement courses may not be offered every semester. Students should work with advisors to create plans of study that ensure they complete all coursework required for their major/s, minor/s, endorsement/s, and/or concentration/s in a timely manner.
- Students should check Spring/Summer course offerings to see if any may be able to fulfill course requirements outside the normal academic year.

**Major Declaration Process:**

1. Declare the desired PCKET Major
  - a. For students pursuing certification for the PK-3 grade band ONLY, choose: "PCKET— Pre-K-3"
  - b. For students pursuing certification for the 3-6 grade band ONLY, choose: "PCKET—3-6"
  - c. For students pursuing certification in both grade bands (PK-3 and 3-6), choose: "PK-6"
2. Declare appropriate Second Major that applies to your PCKET major:

- a. If you are pursuing PK-3 or PK-6 certification, choose: "Educational Studies—Pre-K–3"
  - b. If you are pursuing grade 3-6 certification, choose: "Educational Studies – 3<sup>rd</sup>–6<sup>th</sup> Grade"
3. If you are pursuing Endorsement in ESL, declare the appropriate minor:
- a. If you are pursuing ESL endorsement, choose " Applied Linguistics- Teaching ESL for PCKET with the ESL endorsement"
