Students choosing Russian as a minor program must complete **20 hours** of Russian language beyond RUS 102.

- _____ RUS 202 – Intermediate Russian II (4 cr.)
(prereq: RUS 202 with C (not C-) or better grade.)
- _____ RUS 301 – Advanced Russian Grammar I (3 cr.)
(prereq: RUS 202 with C (not C-) or better).
- _____ RUS 302 – Advanced Russian Grammar II (3 cr.)
(prereq: RUS 301 with C (not C-) or better).
- _____ RUS 304 – Russian Conversation and Composition I (3 cr.)
(prereq: 302 with C (not C-) or better.)
- _____ RUS 306 – Russian Conversation and Composition II (3 cr.)
(prereq: 304 with C (not C-) or better.)

“Recommended” courses for students interested in acquiring a good background on Russia should refer to courses listed under the Russian Studies program. Please note that these courses are not included in the minor program.
