Guide for Declaring the Secondary Education Majors and Minor

- Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
- Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
- Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
 Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose one of the following depending on degree and emphasis area:
 "Group Social Studies-BA or BS Economics" "Group Social Studies-BA or BS Geography"
 "Group Social Studies-BA or BS Secondary History" "Group Social Studies-BA or BS Political Science"
- Click "Submit." The system will automatically declare your 2nd major in "Education" and give you the option to declare a minor. Choose an appropriate minor from the list and then click "Change to New Program"

The minor in History includes seven courses (24 credits) from the following: HST 211 or 301-391. At least one elective must be European or non-Western. In order to meet State Teacher Certification requirements for non-duplication of credits in the Major and the Minor (36 unduplicated in a group Major and 20 unduplicated in the Minor) you may only use two history courses from the Social Studies Major above toward the History Minor.
