Students will not need to take WRT 120/130 or WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

Study Abroad:

Spanish majors interested in teacher certification are <u>required</u> to study abroad for at least one semester (12-15 credits at the 300-level) in a Spanish-language study abroad program. Program must be approved prior to study abroad by a faculty advisor in Spanish and can be used to fulfill major requirement courses. Students who are unable to complete the study abroad requirement will need to complete an alternative plan approved by the Spanish Study Abroad Committee. Please meet with a Spanish faculty advisor as soon as possible to discuss your options.

students seeking teaching certification in Spanish must demonstrate oral proficiency at the Advance Low level or higher on the Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) prior to their student teaching semester.
