**WRT 150** Strategies in Writing: Fulfilled if a student has AP English score of 3, 4 or 5, obtains a B or better grade in their freshman sequence, or has passed the CLEP test.

**Mathematical Science Requirement**: Fulfilled through AP score of 3 or better on the AP Calculus test, OR by taking one of the following courses: another Math course or CIS 160 or PHI 103 or STA 215. Prerequisite to all courses is MTH 110 or its equivalent (which may be determined by your ACT or SAT mathematics subscore, a 3 or better on the AP Calculus test, or placement exam).
