

## 2020 - 2021 Alumni Year-Out Survey

Data from the Michigan Department of Education (MDE)

Responses from GVSU Fall 2019 and Winter 2020 Program Completers (N = 70), who were surveyed by MDE in 2019-2020 and distributed to GVSU in 2021.

Please note: The questions on the 2020-2021 survey were re-written by MDE, and are different from the questions asked in the 2019-2020 Candidate Supervisor Survey.
