

General Information for Secondary Teacher Assisting Applicants (EDI 331)

The enclosed application materials are appropriate forms to use if you are applying for a field placement in Secondary Teacher Assisting (EDI 331)

To assure the most accurate processing, the application packet must be hand delivered to the College of Education at 401C Devos Center 8 am to 5 pm during the week of application intake. All supporting documentation must be included at the time of application, or your application will not be considered. Please do not jeopardize your goals by submitting your application late and/or incomplete

Plan to meet with a College of Education intake staff member when you hand deliver your application.

MINIMUM ADMISSION CRITERIA

In keeping with Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation(CAEP) guidelines and faculty resources to supervise student field placements, the College of Education will admit approximately 200 new students from the pool of qualified applicants to its programs each of the fall and winter semesters only. As a unit granting secondary admission, admission requirements are those which appear in the catalog at the time of application to the unit. Unless otherwise noted, all requirements must be complete at the time of application.

- 1. Academic Achievement. A minimum 2.70 GPA (GVSU) in your overall, major, minor and professional program is required. English majors and minors, Art majors require a 3.00 GPA. Please note that starting Fall 2014 catalog year, Social Studies majors and History majors and minors will both require a 3.00 GPA. Those required GPAs must be met prior to being placed. You may access your current GPAs on MyBanner by going to your MyPath. The GPAs are broken down at the top of each section for your majors and minors.
- 2. Professional Readiness Examination (PRE) or ACT and MME Equivalencies. PRE scores must be officially sent from MTTC to GVSU; copies of the report will not be accepted. Scores can be pending but must be completed and passed prior to your student teaching placement.
- **3. TRANSFER STUDENTS ONLY:** Official ACT or SAT scores, including reading, mathematics, english and writing sub-scores must be sent directly from the ACT/SAT office to the GVSU Records Office.

4. Prerequisite Courses.

Required of all candidates for admission:

- a. EDF 315 Diverse Perspectives on Education
- b. PSY 301 Child Development
- c. EDI 337 Introduction to Learning and Assessment

The GVSU GPA in all required courses must calculate to a 2.70. No individual grade can be below a "C". Transfer equivalents will not be calculated in the GPA; however, the transfer grades must meet requirements or be C or higher.

All prerequisite courses must be completed or in progress during the semester of application.

- 5. Positive Recommendations from your College of Education advisor and your major advisor(s). Must be completed prior to application deadline.
- **6.** Positive Recommendation from an individual who can address the candidate's ability as a prospective teacher (non relative) Must be completed prior to the application deadline.
- 7. Experience. Documentation of 25 hours of experience (paid or unpaid) with children or youth. The experience must be with the age group for which the applicant intends to seek certification. This would rule out, for example, assisting in the university's STUDENT ACADEMIC SUCCESS CENTER. For additional options, refer to the College of Education's Facebook page. Must be completed prior to the application deadline.
- 8. Academic Progress. Completion of a minimum of 60 semester hours and of most of your major/minor and general education requirements. Must be completed during the semester of application.
- 9. University Requirements. Completion of course requirements or test equivalents in Writing 150. Must be completed prior to the application deadline or following Spring/Summer sessions.
- 10. Felony and Misdemeanor signature page must be completed and signed before application is processed.
- 11. A copy of your myPath printed from Banner with your G number handwritten on it.
- 12. Two copies of your current résumé (unstapled) which includes your e-mail address and references on plain white paper. Please do not use color or shading on your résumé as it is scanned and turned into a PDF files and emailed to Principals and/or Cooperating Teachers for potential placement.

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REQUIREMENTS FOR FIELD PLACEMENT

Upon admission to College of Education, the student will be placed for their Teacher Assisting semester, contingent upon an interview and acceptance by the school administrator. Students who postpone their entrance after admission must re-apply as new applicants if they seek readmission. Field placements are generally made within a 50-mile radius from campus. Placements will be made outside this area only if deemed necessary for suitable supervision and effective use of College of Education resources.

SOME QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT YOUR APPLICATION AND SUBSEQUENT PROCEDURES

You are about to submit an application for field placement to the College of Education office. Many students have asked the following questions regarding what happens once the application has been received. We hope that you find the following information helpful as you wait to hear about the decisions which need to be made by the College of Education office.

Question: How long will it be before I know whether or not I've been accepted?

Answer: All applications are carefully reviewed. Therefore, it may be as many as six weeks before you will hear from the

College of Education. A letter indicating the decision will be mailed to you at the local address given to us on your

application. You will also receive information regarding New Student Orientation.

Question: When can I register for my Teacher Assisting and its required courses?

Answer: You will register for courses after you have been admitted and have attended New Student Orientation.

Question: Once I have been accepted into the College of Education, when will I be informed of my Teacher Assisting

placement?

Answer: It takes several weeks for your Placement Coordinator to facilitate placements for all College of Education

applicants. You will learn of your tentative placement by mail and/or email as the placements are secured.

Question: What does a "tentative placement" mean?

Answer: You will receive a form from the College of Education informing you of your tentative placement. You are

required to complete an interview with the Cooperating Teacher and/or Principal with the school to which you will be tentatively assigned. If you are accepted for that field placement, the Cooperating Teacher and/or Principal will sign the placement form. The student will return the placement form via business envelope supplied or hand delivered to College of Education. If for some reason, the first interview does not result in a

placement, the Placement Coordinator will locate a second placement for you.

Question: How should I conduct myself during the interview?

Answer: Dress professionally as though you were going for a job interview. Answer all questions honestly and clearly. It is

also good idea to refer to their website prior to the interview to familiarize yourself with the district and to take

copies of your résumé to your interview.

Question: When should I have CPR/First Aid training completed?

Answer: CPR (Adult/Child) and First Aid training should be completed during your final semester of Student Teaching and

needs to be taken through the American Red Cross, American Heart Association, Medic First Aid, American

Safety and Health Institute (ASHI) and the National Safety Council to qualify.

Question: When do I take my Subject Area Tests for teacher certification?

Answer: Subject Area Tests should be taken when your majors, minors and/or endorsement coursework have been

completed.

If admission is granted, a field placement might not be found due to district policies and procedures. If a student is recommended to the Michigan Department of Education for Teacher Certification, the conviction could have an adverse effect on being granted a teaching certificate. Be advised, if a teaching certificate is granted with convictions or infractions, it does not guarantee K-12 employment.

Verification of Understanding

and Signed Consent to Release Educational Records

Pursuant to federal law, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, (FERPA) requires, subject to specific exceptions, Grand Valley State University to have written permission from its students before releasing any information from a student's educational record.

The academic requirement of Grand Valley State University's College of Education mandates that each of its students complete teacher assisting and student teaching field practicum. In order for field placements to be made by the College of Education, it must be permitted to disclose students' records to school districts, which are prospective placement sites for the students to complete their practicum requirements. Student records include all educational records maintained by the University on behalf of the student. Further, post students' graduation from Grand Valley State University, we are frequently asked to provide employment recommendations. In order for these recommendations to be made by the College of Education, we also need to have permission granted to disclose student records maintained by the University on behalf of the student.

In recognition of the above, applications for admission into the College of Education must include this signed consent to release education records.
