2.01 James Moyer reviewed current projects.

Kirkhof Center addition:

Set to complete at end of April.

Women's Center is moving in from the Commons.

Commons will get some ADA updates for toilets and elevator.

## Mackinac Hall addition:

Set to complete by first of June.

Groups from other buildings (PAD, LSH, AUS, MAK) will move in. Lose 12 existing classrooms on lower level for CLAS advising and RMSC.

## Padnos Hall renovation:

Will add laboratory and research and offices spaces.

## Mackinac Hall 2004 addition renovation:

Will move in IT from MAN to make renovations to MAN.

## Housing:

Honors housing and classrooms to be complete by Aug. Opens space in Neimeyer for Freshmen Center

## Movement Science building:

The dept. office is moving to MAK to help spread out offices

## South campus:

Tanning salon is leaving to make room for Alert program (from GVSU apt.)

## Lake Michigan Hall:

Moved Inst. Marketing downtown to give HR and others more space.

#### Downtown:

Licensed 26,000 sq. ft. from bike factory (south of Secchia Hall) Watson St. warehouse was aquired. Looking into who to take the space.

#### Library:

Planning is in process. In Lansing, the Capital Outlay Comm. is trying to get the bill moving.

#### Health Hill:

Property purchased for parking spaces. We had a rented lot, but MSU purchased it. It is unclear what MSU will do with it.

## West campus area:

Eng. Lang. Services in CHS will move to the Meadows Crossing store front. This allows more space for others in CHS.

#### The Meadows:

HTM project with Meadows expansion will soon be complete for storage, Food prep, and offices. Some time conflicts exist but will be worked out.

## 2.02 Change in faculty workload
