Patricia Clark is Poet-in-Residence and Professor in the Department of Writing at Grand Valley State University. Her poetry has appeared in magazines such as *The Atlantic Monthly, Slate, Poetry, Missis*sippi Review, The Gettysburg Review, New England Review, Pennsylvania Review, North American Review, Stand, and Seattle Review.

She is the author of two books of poetry: My Father on a Bicycle (2005) and North of Wondering (1999) which won the first book competition sponsored by Women in Literature, Inc. Patricia has also coedited an anthology of contemporary women writers called Worlds in Our Words. In 1997 in her poem "The Only Body" won Mississippi Review's Poetry Prize. She has been a scholar at the Broad Loaf Writers' Conference, and a resident at The MacDowell Colony, at Ragdale, the Virginia Center for the Creative Arts, and the Guthrie Center in Annaghmakerrig, Ireland.

In 2009 Patricia will publish *She Walks Into the Sea*, her third book of poems, with Michigan State University Press, and *Given the Trees*, a chapbook in a new series called *Voices from the American Land*.
