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Colleagues,

Top of mind for me this month is how we support our students. This may not be surprising, considering that our students have been vocal in the past few weeks about how we are not meeting their needs. Their actions have given me pause for deeper reflection about student voice and advocacy and the spaces where we explicitly include our students. While the graduation rates for CECI students are improving, see below, during the townhall as I looked around the room and thought about the disparity in graduation rates, it occurred to me what while the room was full to overflowing, approximately half the students in that room may not be here next year considering the existing trends in retention rates. This is a very sobering thought.
