GVSU 2008 Freshman Orientation Survey Results

Following is a report of responses to the 2008 New Student Orientation Survey. This survey was administered to entering freshmen during Orientation sessions in the summer of 2008. Responses that are significantly (α = 0.05) associated with Fall 2008 grades or earned hours are noted. (Bivariate associations between all questions and GPA and earned hours were tested and all significant associations are reported, so if an association is not described, it is not statistically significant.)

- Students who cited room and board costs as the main factor earned significantly higher fall grades than those who cited family and personal responsibilities (3.21 vs. 2.74).
- Those who cited a job as the main factor earned more fall credits (15.75) than those who cited financial aid (14.15) or family obligations (13.45) or those for whom GVSU was their first choice (14.05).

- Students who said they frequently missed days in high school earned lower grades and fewer credits (2.68 & 13.05) than those who responded "sometimes" (3.00 & 14.0) or "never" (3.07 & 14.4).
- Students who said they frequently turned in high school assignments late earned lower grades (2.66) and fewer credits (13.1) than those who said they never did so (3.08 & 14.2).
- Students who said they helped other student frequently in high school got better grades than those who never did (3.05 vs. 2.72).
- Students who said they worked with classmates on group assignments had better average grades than those who said they never did so ("frequently" – 2.98; "sometimes" – 3.05; "never" – 2.41).

- Students who said it was very likely that they would transfer out earned fewer credits than other respondents ("very likely" 13.2; "likely" 13.9; "Unlikely" 14.1; "no chance" 14.1).
- Students who said they were "unlikely" to participate in volunteer or community service work earned lower grades (2.87) than those who responded "very likely" (3.16).
- Although over 90% of entering freshmen say they are likely or very likely to graduate
 within 4 years, only one in four will actually do so. A separate recent survey of 151
 GVSU undergrads indicates that the expectation of a 4-year completion may decay very
 quickly. When asked early in the winter term, barely 50% of students said they would
 finish in 4 years. That percentage dropped only slightly with each successive year.

 Students who said they planned to complete 30 hours earned more credits (14.1) than those who didn't (13.8).

- Those who said they'd meet regularly with an advisor earned better grades than others (3.06 vs. 2.90).
- Those who planned to explore a major in the first year had a higher GPA (3.06) than those who didn't (2.95).
- Grades were better among students who said they'd declare a major in the first 2 years than among others (3.03 vs. 2.94).
- Students who said they'd develop and follow an educational plan earned better grades than those who didn't (3.03 vs. 2.95).
- Those who planned to go over their plan with an advisor every term had higher grades (3.06 vs. 2.95).
