The summer/fall share will be a mix of cold season and warm season crops over 11 weeks. Shareholders can expect to receive a mix of the following – spinach, leaf lettuce, scallions, turnips, kale, carrots, tomatoes, peppers, squash, beans, corn, cucumbers, and a variety of others.

If you purchase a share for the entire season you have two options:

- \$220 with weekly pick-up at the Farmer's Market (delivery included after Market closes for the year)
- \$250 with weekly delivery on the Allendale campus included

If you sign up for a CSA share after the season begins the weekly cost will be:

- \$23 per week for Farmer's Market pick-up (delivery included after Farm Market season closes)
- \$25 per week, including delivery each week on the Allendale campus

Note: Produce pick up at the Farmer's Market (parking lot G) September 3–24, 10:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
