## **PAS Policy and Procedure for Integrated Pediatric Clinical Rotations**

**Policy**: All PAS students receive a supervised clinical practice experience at a clinical site with access to pediatric patient populations and with a preceptor qualified in pediatrics.

## Procedure:

- 1. Pediatric rotation learning outcomes are embedded in the family practice, underserved, and emergency medicine clinical rotations.
- 2. All students have supervised clinical practice experiences (SCPEs) at a site with access to pediatric patient populations (as described in the PAS Program Policy and Procedure for New Clinical Site Development) and with a preceptor qualified to provide care to infants, children, and adolescents (as described in the PAS Policy and Procedure on Assuring Faculty Qualifications) to allow the students to meet the pediatric rotation learning outcomes. These SCPEs occur in either family medicine or underserved clinical rotations to allow students to provide acute, chronic, and preventive care. Pediatric experiences also occur in the emergency medicine clinical rotation to allow students to provide emergent pediatric care.
- 3. PAS program clinical faculty indicate in Typhon® which SCPE preceptor is responsible for evaluating the pediatric rotation learning outcomes on the Preceptor Evaluation of the Student.
- 4. All students are assessed for medical knowledge related to infants, children, and adolescents on the pediatric end-of-rotation examination that is administered after the first four weeks of the family medicine clinical rotation.
