# STUDY ABROAD SEMESTER GRANT GUIDELINES

## **Purpose**

The purpose of this grant is to offer financial assistance to students in need of additional resources in order to participate in a semester or academic year study abroad program. Priority will be given to students studying abroad for an academic year and participating in non-traditional study abroad locations.

#### **Amount**

Grant awards will vary based on a student's need and the cost of the academic program. The average grant award is \$500 per semester. The maximum amount that will be awarded is \$1750 per semester.

## **Application Process**

There is no application for this grant program. Students will automatically be considered for grant funding if they meet all of the eligibility criteria.

## **Eligibility Criteria**

- Students must have a minimum of a 2.5 cumulative GPA
- Must be a full-time, degree-seeking student at GVSU (both undergraduate and graduate students are eligible)
- Must have a completed Study Abroad Application submitted by the priority consideration deadline (see PIC for details)
- Must be studying abroad for a minimum of 1 semester: Fall or winter semesters only. No summer study abroad programs will be considered.
- Must have a completed FAFSA on file with the Financial Aid Office, and have demonstrated need. Students who are not eligible to apply for FAFSA should contact the Padnos International Center.
- Students must attend the required pre-departure orientation sponsored by the Padnos International Center.

## **Conditions**

- Students must be accepted by the Padnos International Center and the study abroad provider in order to be funded.
- Students receiving the Barbara H. Padnos Scholarship, Murray Scholarship, or the Partnership Grant are not eligible for this grant.

#### **Selection Process**

The PIC Grant Review Committee will consider all study abroad applicants that meet the eligibility criteria and conditions. Not all eligible students will be awarded a grant. Students with a high Expected Family Contribution (EFC) determined by FAFSA may not receive a grant due to the limited funding available.

Grants will be awarded taking into consideration the cost of a study abroad program, and the financial need of the applicant.
