STUDY ABROAD MYTHS

STUDY ABROAD PARTICIPANTS MUST SPEAK ANOTHER LANGUAGE.

Students are not required to speak a second language to study abroad. Most programs offer courses taught in English even in nonEnglish-speaking countries.

STUDY ABROAD IS NOT AFFORDABLE.

Many programs are similar in cost to a semester at Grand Valley, some are less expensive and others considerably more expensive. Financial aid, scholarships, and grants can help cover study abroad program costs.

STUDYING ABROAD WILL DELAY MY GRADUATION.

Careful program and course selection allow a student to stay on track with degree progress. Students should talk to their study abroad adviser and academic adviser about making an academic plan.

STUDYING ABROAD IS NOT RELEVANT TO MY FUTURE CAREER.

Employers are increasingly realizing the value of candidates with the maturity, flexibility, and intercultural competence developed during study abroad. In our global economy, international experience will help students be competitive in the job market.

STUDY ABROAD IS NOT FOR NONTRADITIONAL STUDENTS.

PIC is committed to helping students find a program that accommodates time restraints and family/professional obligations. Many nontraditional students choose to participate in faculty-led programs, which range from two to eight weeks in duration.

ACADEMICS ABROAD

PIC recommends that students talk to their academic adviser and study abroad adviser about how study abroad fits into their academic plan.

Students should not limit themselves to English-speaking destinations! Most programs offer courses taught in English, even in countries where English is not the primary language.

What requirements can I fulfill abroad?

While abroad, students are able to take courses that will fulfill:

- Major requirements
 - Minor requirements
 - General education requirements (Foundations & Cultures, Issues)
- University requirements (Supplemental Writing Skills, B.A./B.S. Degree Cognate)
 - Electives

IDS 180 Class: Students who are interested in studying abroad are encouraged to take IDS 180. This one credit course is meant to introduce students to the challenges and opportunities of international travel and to provide them with basic tools for ensuring a successful study abroad experience. Contact PIC for details.

GVSU Faculty-led Programs

Students participating in a faculty-led program will register for GVSU courses. Students will earn a grade and courses will appear on their GVSU transcript upon completion of the program.

GVSU Partnerships/NonGVSU Programs

Students participating in a partnership or nonGVSU program will either register for courses that have been preapproved or will go through a course approval process. This process involves having courses evaluated and approved by the appropriate department. Detailed information is available at www.gvsu.edu/studyabroad/.

Intercultural Training Certificate

A study abroad program that involves significant and intentional immersion into a host culture may qualify as a practicum component of GVSU's Intercultural Training Certificate (ITC). The ITC program trains students to learn and work successfully in diverse environments. This qualification is attractive to employers seeking colleagues and employees with global skills. Students need to complete ITC 100 prior to using their study abroad as their practicum. Review the ITC certificate curriculum at www.gvsu.edu/itc or email the program's director at itc@gvsu.edu.

FUNDING STUDY ABROAD

How do I fund my program?

Students typically fund study abroad through a combination of financial aid, scholarships, grants, and personal funds.

Study abroad costs vary depending on the program a student selects. While some programs are more expensive, the majority of programs are similar to what you would spend at GVSU and some may even be less. There are 15 GVSU programs that may save a student money when compared to the cost of a semester at GVSU. With research and early planning, study abroad can be affordable. Students can use their GVSU financial aid award toward the cost of a study abroad program in most cases. Please ask your study abroad adviser for more information.

Student Teaching Placement

In English-speaking countries, student teachers are placed in local schools affording excellent opportunities to become acquainted with the culture and educational system. The curriculum follows national models and students come from the local community. In nonEnglish-speaking countries, students are placed in schools where they will be delivering instruction in English. These are nonprofit, nondenominational schools established to provide bilingual instruction for entrance in universities and colleges in the United States or other countries. Classes range from kindergarten through secondary school. The curriculum follows American or Western European models in combination with the curriculum of the host country.

Application Process

You must apply for COST through the College of Education. All Grand Valley standard eligibility requirements must be met. Students will be guided through the application process, adhering to the requirements determined by COST. Those accepted to COST will have demonstrated above average ability, good character, flexibility, strong motivation, successful completion of the Teacher Assisting, and a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
