

National Rankings and Recognition


Grand Valley was included in the 2022 list of "Best Colleges in America" by Money. Criteria for the ranking included affordability, high graduation rates and quality of education.

Forbes listed Grand Valley as one of "America's Top College" for offering an excellent education at a great price and graduating high-earners.






Employment and Placement After Graduation

84% of GVSU graduates are either employed or pursuing additional education.













Net Cost of Tuition for a Typical GVSU Student







Ratio of State Aid vs. Tuition at Grand Valley





Environmental Sustainability

For the 13th consecutive year, the Princeton Review Guide to Green Colleges recognized Grand Valley's strong commitments to the environment in its campus policies, programs and practices.

Grand Valley was rated a top performer on the 2022 Sustainable Campus Index, earning gold status from the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education. Criteria covered five overall areas: academics, engagement, operations, planning and administration, and innovation and leadership.

During one week in September, campus community members collected 1.51 tons of garbage from the Grand River during a Making Waves event. The university-wide initiative explored and investigated the many ways that water touches lives, from being essential for life to defining GVSU in relation to the Grand River and Lake Michigan.

Private Giving to Grand Valley


Thanks to the generosity of more than 11,000 donors in the 2021/2022 fiscal year, more than \$25 million was raised for Grand Valley students and our community. The endowment ended the fiscal year at \$168.5 million as of June 30, 2022, which was a fairly stable year despite market fluctuations. Thanks to 20 new endowed funds, including 14 new donor-funded scholarships, thousands of students were supported by private gifts this year. The number of new donors continues to broaden the base of support for the university, especially among alumni donors. As Grand Valley continues to innovate and lead the transformation of higher education for tomorrow's learners, we rely on donor support, and we thank you for all you do for Grand Valley students and our community.
