¹Students who self-place into WRT 150 should take this course in the fall semester of their first year. Students who self-place into WRT 120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of their first year; this will push back the ability to take ENG 215 and 216 and potentially require additional time to graduation. Students will not need to take WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

Guide for Declaring the Secondary Education Majors

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select “Student”, “Student Records”, and then, “Change Major” Click on the “Change Major 1/Program” box.
3. Click on the down arrow in the box next to “New Major 1/Program,” from here scroll down and choose “English-BA Secondary Education.”
4. Click “Submit.” The system will automatically declare your 2nd major in “Education” and give you the option to declare a minor. Choose an appropriate minor from the list and then click “Change to New Program.”
