

## Advising Sheet for GVSU's ESL Minor

The ESL track of the Applied Linguistics minor is a Michigan Department of Education-approved teachable minor for elementary (grades PK-6) and secondary (7-12) education majors. The ESL minor leads to MDE ESL endorsement, an add-on credential to an initial State of Michigan teaching license, after successful completion of the curriculum and passing the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) for ESL. The curriculum includes 6 required courses in English (18 credits) and a teaching practicum in the College of Education (5 credits), for a total of 23 credits.
