Through our Queer Connections Mentoring Program, these students met with an LGBTQIA+ faculty/staff member monthly for the academic year.

# **PROGRAMS & EFFORTS**

## Evening Clubs

These weekly clubs are by and for students and include Ace of Clubs (ace/aro students), Bi-Furious (non-monosexual students), Colors of Pride (LGBTQ students of color), First-year Queer Alliance, General Queer Alliance, NeuroQueers (neurodivergent, queer students), and T2 (trans and non-binary students).

### Queer Connections Mentoring Program

This mentoring program pairs LGBTQIA+ students with out faculty and staff. Mentoring pairs meet regularly over a six-month period, during which they build connections, explore resources, and work toward collaboratively-constructed goals.

## Events

Annual events included the Rainbow Social, Queer the Air, QueeraPOOLooza, Wear the Rainbow, and Lavender Graduation (recognizing 17 graduates!). Nine student-led Open Door Discussions were held in the Center.

### Mads Terpstra LGBT Resource Center Library

Available to all GVSU faculty, staff, and students, our library is linked to the main library's inventory. There are 482 books and 139 DVDs that are available for checkout. All LGBTQIA+ topics and authors!

## TRAININGS

## **LGBTQ Foundations**

LGBTQ Foundations, Level I: Terminology and Language -Begin by building a strong foundation through an exploration of inclusive language, terminology, and a breakdown of LGBTQIA+ identities. Participants will gain clarity on concepts such as gender identity, sexual orientation, and the gender spectrum.

LGBTQ Foundations, Level II: Gender Identity and Expression -A comprehensive exploration of gender diversity, fostering understanding and empathy for the spectrum of gender identities beyond the binary.

LGBTQ Foundations, Level III: Privilege, Power, and Oppression -Understand how various social identities intersect and impact LGBTQIA+ experiences. Delve into the broader social justice movement and the role of LGBTQIA+ rights within it. Examine unconscious biases and stereotypes that may hinder LGBTQIA+ inclusion.

#### LGBTQ Foundations, Level IV: Make NOISE -

Developing strategic action plans to integrate LGBTQIA+ inclusion into leadership practices. Through interactive activities and case studies, attendees will learn how to create comprehensive organizational policies, foster a culture of open communication, and implement initiatives that champion diversity and acceptance. By equipping leaders with actionable strategies, this session empowers them to drive transformative change, elevate inclusivity as a core value, and ensure that LGBTQIA+ individuals are safe, valued, respected, and empowered within their organizations.

23 LGBTQ Foundations sessions were facilitated during the academic year, with 98% positive feedback.
