GRAND VALLEY STATE UNIVERSITY New Faculty Guide to Graduate School

The Graduate School (TGS) provides leadership and support for graduate education. TGS offers programming and advising to assist masters, specialist, doctoral, certificate, and badge students through transitions from prospective, to enrolled, and to graduating students.

TGS is responsible for the following:

- Administration of the Graduate Assistantship Program, including oversight of the GA policy, processing GA appointments, ensuring student eligibility, advising units on requesting GAs in their annual budget requests, allocating GAs to units, awarding special project assistantships, assisting Pls with requesting GAs in grant proposals, and hosting the New Graduate Assistant Orientation prior to the start of each academic semester.
- Hosting the **Graduate Showcase**, an opportunity for graduate students to showcase their research, scholarly, and service activity. The event is held in April of each year.
- Sponsoring the **3-Minute Thesis Competition (3MT)**, held in February of each year, where graduate students present a summary of their thesis/dissertation. Cash prizes are awarded, and the winner goes on to compete in the Midwestern Association of Graduate Schools 3MT Competition.
- Hosting the **New Graduate Student Orientation**, held just prior to the beginning of each academic semester, includes an information session in Loosemore Auditorium and a Resource Fair with numerous GVSU departments, units, and offices that support students.
- Hosting the Graduate School Citations for Academic Excellence and Graduate Student Celebration, to recognize outstanding achievement of graduate students and graduate faculty. The event is held near the end of the Fall and Winter semesters. The Graduate School sends out a call for nominations from all graduate programs for awards in the following areas: Academic Excellence in a Degree Program, Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation, Outstanding Master's Thesis, Outstanding Final Project, Outstanding Publication, Excellence in Service to the Community or Profession, Excellence in Leadership and Service to GVSU, Excellence in Promoting Inclusion and Diversity at GVSU, and Excellence in Sustainability. Nominations of graduate faculty are made by graduate students in the following award areas: Kimboko Inclusion, Outstanding Mentorship, and Outstanding Teaching.
- Providing administrative support to the Graduate Council, a faculty governance body for graduate
 education policies, curriculum, and program review, by maintaining the membership roster and
 meeting schedule, posting minutes, collaborating on and disseminating new policy information,
 and assisting with graduate program review.
- Oversight of the **Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR)** training requirement for graduate students.
- Supporting the **Graduate Student Association (GSA)** in its mission to promote interdisciplinary communication and collaboration to enhance a holistic graduate student experience and build a graduate community. Support includes coordinating the budget and travel/expense reimbursements for registered graduate student organizations that receive funding via the GSA.

- Publishing the monthly 6 in 60 Newsletter and GradNews Across the Nation, the Graduate
 Director's Handbook, the Graduate Faculty Handbook, the Graduate Student Guidebook, the
 Advising Guidebook for Graduate Students, the Faculty and Staff Advising Guidebook, and the
 Graduate Education Policies and Procedures Manual.
- Collecting graduate student data via **Graduate Student Exit Survey**, in order to obtain meaningful information to ensure high impact learning experiences for our students. The results are shared with each individual graduate program.
- Administering the **Presidential Research Grant** program, that provides awards up to \$1,500 to support the research projects of graduate students. Applications are accepted 3 times per year: June 1 for Fall research, October 1 for Winter research, and March 1 for Spring/Summer research.
- Administering the **Graduate Academic Conference Fund**, that awards grants of up to \$600 for domestic travel, and \$800 for international travel, to support student presentations at academic conferences.
- Oversight of the **Guidelines for the Preparation of Theses and Dissertations**, and Thesis, Dissertation and Doctoral Project committee approvals. TGS also tracks continuous enrollment and processes the final approval of all theses and dissertations.
- Facilitation of the required **Thesis and Dissertation Workshop**, which provides information and resources for graduate students completing a thesis or dissertation as the culminating experience within their graduate program.
- Oversight of the Graduate Faculty Application process, approving Graduate Faculty Status per the
 Policies on the Qualifications for Faculty Engaged in Graduate Education (regular and adjunct),
 and maintaining the Graduate Faculty Database.
- Enforcing graduate policies as published in the Graduate Education Policies and Procedures
 Manual, assisting faculty and students on Petitions for Exception to Graduate Academic Policies
 and reviewing student petitions for final decision.
- Publishing Faculty and Graduate Student Success Stories and assisting programs with website or publication updates for marketing and recruitment purposes.
- Coordinating the Michigan Intercollegiate Graduate Studies (MIGS) Program which allows students to take graduate courses at other Michigan graduate schools with prior approval of the faculty. TGS processes MIGS forms and communicates with the other institution once approved.
- Facilitating the PACES program which offers professional development opportunities for students, and helps students increase their professionalism, academic advancement, communication, engagement and success. By participating in PACES, students will be supported in developing communications, interview, stress management and debt management skills – among other critical and timely topics.
