Marth Councill-Vargas

“Musically profound, powerfully rhythmic...” (Gramophone Magazine), flutist **Martha Councill-Vargas** enjoys an adventurous career as a soloist, chamber musician, and multi-media artist, with performances in Europe, China, and throughout the Americas. She has performed concertos with the Orquesta Sinfónica Nacional de Ecuador (Quito), as a guest artist for the Festival Internacional de Flautistas in Lima, Peru, on Chicago’s Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concert Series, and at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall. Dr. Councill-Vargas earned degrees from Oberlin Conservatory, The Shepherd School of Music at Rice University, and the University of Iowa. She is currently Professor of Flute at Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo.

Ann DuHamel

Praised as poetic and “... a delight for the ears and the soul” (Encuentro Universitario Internacional de Saxofón, Mexico City), pianist and McKnight Fellow **Ann DuHamel** delights in a multi-dimensional and eclectic musical career. Her performances have spanned 20 countries and 37 of the United States, including Carnegie Weill Recital Hall. Ann currently serves as Associate Professor of Music at the University of Minnesota Morris, where she devotes herself to the mission of sharing high quality traditional and contemporary classical music with students and the greater community. She is a Past President of Minnesota Music Teachers Association. She earned the Doctorate of Musical Arts degree at the University of Iowa under the tutelage of Ksenia Nosikova.
