Laurie provides trainings for social workers in the area of self care, substance use, and secondary trauma for front line staff just to name a few. She also provides groups using EMDR-IGTP to address traumatic community incidents. In addition, she provides supervision for interns, new clinical social workers and seasoned social workers. Laurie is also a delegate for NASW Michigan, and volunteers to address criminal justice reform. During her free time, Laurie likes to spend time with her family, listen to true crime podcasts, hike, practice yoga, meditate and read a good book.
