<sup>1</sup>Students must complete a total of two courses with an SWS attribute. One SWS course should be in the major, the other SWS course should be in the College of Education. A grade of C or higher is required to fulfill the SWS requirements. SWS Courses are built into the HPE major. <sup>2</sup> Students who self-place into WRT 120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of the first year. Students who self-place into WRT 150 should take this course in the winter semester of the first year. A grade of C or higher is required to fulfill the WRT requirements.

<sup>3</sup>Students will complete a semester of elementary and a semester of secondary Health and Physical Education experience (TA and ST) during their Teacher Preparation Program.

CPR (Adult/Child) and First Aid training should be completed during your final semester of Student Teaching and needs to be taken through either the American Red Cross, American Heart Association, Medic First Aid, American Safety and Health Institute (ASHI) and the National Safety Council to qualify.

### Declaring the Health & Physical Education Teacher Education Major and the Education Major:

- 1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
- 2. Once logged in select "Student," "Student Records," and then "Change Major"
- 3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
- 4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "Health and Physical Education Teacher Education"
- 5. Click "Submit" and then "Change to New Program"
- 6. Return to the Change Major Screen and select "Add or Change Second Major"
- 7. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 2," from here, scroll down and choose "Education" from the list and then click "Submit" and "Add Second Major"
