A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.
- 2 Students who opt for the WRT 120/130 stretch writing sequence should plan to take PSY 301 during the spring/summer semester between first and second year of the program. Students must complete a total of two courses with an SWS attribute.
