- ~ A GPA of 2.7 or above in Engineering Foundation courses. Foundation courses are designated by an asterisk (\*) on this guide. ~
- Completion of each course in the Engineering Foundation with a grade of C (2.0) or above, with no more than one repeat.
- ~ Completion of preparation for placement in the cooperative engineering education course, EGR 289.

#### Honors:

The Frederik Meijer Honors College and the School of Engineering have approved the following substitutions for the honors curriculum:

- Together, EGR 100 and EGR 185 fulfill the HNR 251 requirement. 1)
- 2) EGR 290 fulfills the HNR 300 requirement.
- EGR 485 fulfills the HNR 401 requirement. 3)
- 4) EGR 486 fulfills the HNR 499 requirement.
- 5) The completion of the honors curriculum will fulfill the engineering ethics requirement.
- All GVSU students must earn credit for two Supplemental Writing Skills (SWS) courses. Honors students can earn credit for one SWS course by 6) completing HNR 154 (the winter semester of a first-year sequence) with a grade of C or better. They must earn their second SWS course credit outside of the Honors requirements.

#### Major Notes:

An emphasis area is required for the Interdisciplinary Engineering major. Emphasis areas include: Data Science, Design & Innovation, Engineering 1) Management, Environmental Engineering, Mechatronics and Renewable Energy.

- To declare this emphasis, login to MyBanner, select "Student Records" and then "Change Major." a.
- Click on "Change Major 1" and select Interdisciplinary Engineering Renewable Energy Emphasis. b.
- Click "Submit" and then "Change to New Program." c.
- EGR 224, EGR 330 and EGR 323 are prerequisite courses for selected upper-level electives. Students are required to take four IE Track electives. d. Please plan ahead! Course descriptions are listed in the GVSU Academic Catalog.
- Students must complete EITHER EGR 360 OR 362. A track elective should be taken in the other semester. 2)

### Recommendations:

It is strongly encouraged that students do not begin or break curriculum thread by taking courses at other institutions.

For example: Taking MTH 201 equivalent elsewhere, then return to Grand Valley and continuing in the math thread with MTH 202.
