

How can Making Artificial Intelligence-Proof Assignments Improve Your Class?



However, she wanted to make updates to ensure everything still worked, given the popularity of generative AI tools such as ChatGPT. However, she found that doing an AI Audit of her syllabus improved her courses overall. She found even more appreciation for tools that allow students to annotate readings with multimedia, adding multi-modal and interactive layers that go beyond a written reflection.

These were 3+ credit lecture/discussion courses with a high score in both satisfaction and challenge, with a response rate over 50%, and with enrollment at or over 15 students for undergraduate courses or 10 students for graduate courses. Alexis Oosting' is the first instructor to pull a hat trick and have three courses make the list in the same term. The courses with five-star recognition in the

winter 2024 semester are:

- Duane Zuber's HTM373.01 (Hospitality Information Analysis)
- Alexis Oosting's EDS306.01 (Instructional Methods and Inclusive Practices for Students with Disabilities), EDS323.03 (Teaching Students with Language and Literacy Learning Difficulties), and EDS332.02a (Methods and Strategies of Special Education Teaching)

Note that the five-star recognition is not a list of all courses with high student satisfaction, nor is it a formal teaching evaluation. Rather it is equivalent to a "student choice" award and thus is intentionally a statistical rarity.
