Faculty/Staff, Alumni, and Students

Several students from the **School of Community Leadership and Development** will participate in a series of "coffee chats" where students and professionals come together to discuss philanthropy and social impact. The <u>first video was released</u> recently, featuring **Spandana Vemavarapu**, MPA graduate student. We are excited about this partnership with the Johnson Center for Philanthropy at GVSU and Geneva Global!

Students in the **School of Criminology, Criminal Justice, and Legal Studies** program had the unique opportunity to step into the role of a federal agent, thanks to a partnership with Homeland Security Investigations (HSI). HSI agents led GVSU students through immersive exercises pertaining to their classwork in Criminal Justice 312. Students participated in a variety of simulations and activities focused on bulk cash smuggling, cryptocurrency and romance scams, investigative surveillance, and search warrants. Students were also guided by HSI agents through a search warrant demonstration and exercise.



On November 1, we held our annual **CECI Give Back event at Public Thread**. Our volunteers exceeded expectations and had a great time giving back.



Fall Student Census


BIPOC students, percent by major


