Winter 2025's Global Awareness Collaborative Colloquium: Japan

February 17 | 12:00 PM | University Club (107D DEV) | Pew Campus

The Colloquium begins with associate professor of **Criminal Justice** Naoki Kanaboshi presenting, "**Adventure into the Japanese Criminal Justice System.**" He will discuss his research and his study-abroad experiences related to Japan. Lunch will feature a Japanese Rice Bowl, Wakame & Cucumber Salad, and Matcha Roll Cake. This will be followed at 1:00 PM by a trivia contest: "**Win Dr. Kanaboshi's Candy!**"

<u>February 19 | 7:30 PM | Louis Armstrong Theatre, Haas Center for Performing Arts | Allendale Campus</u>

The GVSU Symphony Orchestra conducted by Joel Schut will present two works as part of the GACC. Kōsaku Yamada's short (3.5 minute) *Overture in D*, composed in 1912, is considered the very first piece of Japanese orchestral music. The other, longer work is the world premiere of Tony Gu's *Anime Symphonic Suite*, a multi-media work highlighting the rich visual and sound tradition of Japanese Anime. The post-concert reception will feature Japanese Cheesecake, Warabi Mochi (rice cake), and Yokan (red bean jelly).

Screening of Akira Kurosawa's *Ikiru* (score of 98% fresh on Rotten Tomatoes). Released in 1952, *Ikiru* translates to the phrase "to live." Kanji Watanabe is a career municipal bureaucrat, having risen to chief of Public Affairs, when he is diagnosed with terminal cancer. Thus begins his search for a purpose to his life.

First Year Advising Hold

What is the First Year Advising Hold?

All students in their **first year** at Grand Valley State University are required to meet with an academic advisor before registering for classes for the upcoming academic year. This includes both freshman and any transfer students in their

first year at GVSU. This hold does not go into effect until after the first week of classes in the Winter semester. Registration opens in late March, so we would encourage students to meet with their advisor before their registration date to have the advising hold lifted.

How do I get my First Year Advising Hold Lifted?

- Meet with an Advisor in a one-on-one advising session.
- Sessions are 30-minute long one-on-one appointments.

Signing up for a one-on-one Advising appointment can be done by calling our office at 616-331-6890, or through <u>Navigate360</u> with your GVSU network ID and password.
