

Results from the National Alumni Career Mobility Survey (NACM) survey provide strong evidence that participation in internships or field study has a positive effect on alumni attitudes on their career preparations at GVSU. While this is expected, participation in internships or field study colors alumni perceptions of their entire educational experience, well beyond career preparedness. Alumni who report remembering participation in internships or field study are more positive about their educational experience on 52 of NACM's 57 Likert-scale questions. For further details...
