Community Engagement

The **PK12 Advisory Council** is comprised of regional birth through grade 12 building and district administrators and directors, who meet twice annually with GVSU education program faculty and staff for information, feedback, and to guide CECI educator preparation. On June 17th the Advisory Council hosted 22 local administrators and fourteen GVSU staff and faculty for a rich dialogue. The group welcomed Dr. Lisa Perhamus and Dr. Greg Warsen of the Padnos/Sarosik Center for Civil Discourse, and they led administrators in a conversation on relevant challenges faced by educators and administrators in the current social, cultural, and political climates of today. Participants engaged in feedback sessions on CECI teacher candidate data, draft advanced program surveys, and networked throughout the day.





On May 16, 2024, the **Groundswell Stewardship Initiative** hosted over 400 students, educators, families, and friends for its 14th annual Student Project Showcase at GVSU. Attendees enjoyed an outdoor picnic, crafts, raffles, yard games, and most importantly: learning from student scholars. Beautiful weather made the evening a fantastic event for the community to come together to celebrate our scholars and teachers' stewardship efforts.






