Students in the INT major design their own area of focus with support from faculty and professional advisors. Area of focus includes Contextual Electives typically at the 100 and 200 level in addition to at least 5 courses at the 300 level. Examples of Area of Focus include Leadership Skills, Business Fundamentals, Global Communication, Ethics and Social Justice, Community and Sacred Space, Peace and Conflict Studies. Student must have a **minimum of 120 credits** to graduate with **58 of the 120 credits** being from a senior level institution and the **final 30 of the 120 credits** completed at GVSU.

Since INT requires approximately 50 credits to complete the major, most students will complete a minor in addition to the INT major. See your professional advisor to talk about second majors, minors, and certificates for programs of interest to you.

Math Placement: Students must fulfill MTH 110 either by taking the course or waive the requirement through math placement prior to taking STA 215.

Writing Requirements:

Students who self-place into WRT 120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of their first year. Students who self-place into WRT 150 can take the course in either fall or winter. Students will not need to take WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 120/130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

Students must complete a total of two courses with an SWS attribute. A grade of C or better is required in order to satisfy the SWS requirements at GVSU.

Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science Degree Requirements: INT students can pursue a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree.

B.S. Course Requirements

Students seeking the Bachelor of Science in the Integrative Studies major must successfully complete INT 301, STA 215 and one additional more approved statistical or research methods BS degree course. (See curriculum guide for complete list of BS degree options.) The Bachelor of Science does not require any Natural Science courses or lab science courses beyond those already completed for General Education.

B.A. Course Requirements

Students seeking a Bachelor of Arts in the Integrative Studies major must demonstrate third semester proficiency in a foreign language by successfully completing a 201-level language course, passing a proficiency exam in the language chosen, or through AP credit.
