### Graduation Honors

The cords, stoles, sashes, and flags of different colors worn by some of the graduates are part of a special commencement tradition. They represent honors distinctions and recognize academic excellence or achievements in leadership. Some of the honors are based on grade point averages; other honors involve meritorious scholarship in fields of study or notable work for a particular organization.

Whether the distinction comes as part of a national honor society or is specific to Grand Valley — such as graduating from the Frederik Meijer Honors College — the colors of the garb have special meanings. Garb awarded by national academic organizations are generally the color attributed to a particular discipline. Those awarded by the university and nonacademic organizations generally represent a level of achievement and are unique to the university.

All of the garb signifies the students' dedication and hard work during their time at GVSU - attributes that will, no doubt, play a significant role in their future as well.

For the Fall 2024 graduates who may qualify for the honors distinction once final grades are posted, the designation of "honors candidate" has been granted.

Honors will be awarded as follows:

Summa cum laude — 3.9-4.00 Magna cum laude — 3.75-3.899 Cum laude — 3.5-3.749

### Guest Speaker

*Chris Hammer* GVSU alumnus Mathematics, Secondary Education, B.S. '09

During Chris Hammer's time at GVSU, he earned five All-American honors in cross-country/track and was a member of nine GLIAC Championship teams.

It was after his collegiate career when Hammer, a congenital below-elbow amputee, was introduced to the world of para sport. He made his debut representing the United States in Para Track in 2011. He would go on to compete at the London 2012 Paralympic Games in track before transitioning to the sport of triathlon. In his 12 years as a triathlete, Hammer has competed in more than 50 international Paratriathlon events, including three more Paralympic Games (Rio 2016, Tokyo 2020, Paris 2024). After narrowly missing the podium in Rio and Tokyo, Hammer won the gold medal at the Paris Paralympic Games at 38 years old. Hammer is the first and only American paratriathlete to have met the criteria to compete against professional triathletes in long-course triathlon racing. He is a 2022 inductee into the GVSU Athletics Hall of Fame.

Outside of the sport of triathlon, Hammer has earned an M.S. in sport administration from Eastern Washington University, as well as a Master of Business Administration and a Ph.D. in sport psychology from the University of Utah.

Hammer and his wife, Amy, have two daughters, Peyton and Brooklyn.
